



## The ROPE (Replace Our Play Equipment) Project

The Playing Field Committee is currently applying for grant funding to allow us to replace the old and worn play equipment on the Playing Field.

We are delighted to have been successful in our application to the Tesco Bags of Help Grant Scheme. The ROPE Project will be put forward to a customer vote in Tesco stores from 1 July to 31 August 2017.

For those not familiar with the Scheme. three projects are put forward for public vote in Tesco stores. Blue tokens are given to customers at the checkouts and are also available at the self-service checkouts. The customer then votes by putting their token into the container for their favourite project on their way out of the shop. Customers can vote every time they shop during the voting period. The project that secures the highest number of votes will be awarded £4,000. The second placed project receives £2,000 and third place receives £1,000. These community awards are funded by the 5p levy on plastic bags.

At the time of writing, we have not received confirmation as to which Tesco stores in the area will take part in the voting. As soon as this information is available we will post this on Facebook and in next month's Life. Please keep your eyes peeled for updates and as from 1 July, get voting!

# Your Life Mag Editor WALKED to Brighton, and he'd love to say thank you to those who sponsored him

ou may remember back in the May issue I told you all about my big plan to walk 100km (62 miles) from London to Brighton, pretty much non-stop for the small charity, **South London Cares.** 

Well, you'll be pleased to hear that I **completed** the walk in **29 hours**, **48 minutes**. It took maybe a little longer than planned, but I put that down to spending too much time at the designated rest-stops along the route, restocking all my snacks and re-taping my poor feet. But nevertheless I am extremely proud of my effort.

I must say a massive thank you to those who sponsored me, helping me raise an amazing £776 for South London Cares.

I will admit, it was the most gruelling challenge I have ever done. There were aches, there were pains, there were tears. I'm not ashamed to say I cried a little at 72km, at around 5am on the Sunday morning.

The whole experience had left my body broken and exhausted. It's easy to underestimate just how far Brighton actually is. Our route took us from Richmond, South West London, along the Thames, through Surrey suburbs, under the M25, down Sussex country lanes, under the Gatwick flight path, across fields, up the South Downs, and eventually, into Brighton.

Upon crossing the finish line at Brighton Racecourse, as the adrenaline wore off, the aches set in. Everything was in pain, and I was so tired. I had done 157,818 steps and burnt 4,708 calories. My feet had blisters (although granted, not as bad as some people), I could barely walk, lift my legs, sit down, get up, climb stairs, get into bed, get out of bed... well, you get the idea. The journey back to London later that day was no fun at all, I can tell you.

But, despite all the agony, it was experience I'll never forget. And, quite probably, NEVER do again.

## AUGUST BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

ith the Summer Holidays in full swing and a heatwave upon us, we are warning young people to stay safe in the County's waterways and making you aware of the dangers of swimming in open water.

With the sun shining, the public and particularly young people are more inclined to gather around waterways to socialise and enjoy the weather, and we have seen this during the past weeks.

We want to remind people to keep our #RememberRony campaign on their minds before they get tempted to cool down in rivers and lakes and instead go to a supervised lido. Young people often gather near lakes and rivers, some of which are not always the easiest to access for emergency vehicles and many which are actually private property, not designed for public swimming with no lifeguard on site.

The fire service's **#RememberRony** campaign aims to educate young people about the risks associated with open water. It is backed by the family of Huntingdon schoolboy Rony John, who sadly died in 2014 during the first week of the summer holidays, while playing with friends in the Great River Ouse.

It is important for parents and young people to be aware of the many risks that open water possesses, such as being deeper than anticipated, with hazards below the surface to get trapped on. Even though the sun may be shining, the water could still be very cold causing the body to cramp up quickly and posing a risk to you getting out the water safely.

It is also important that if you see someone in trouble in water that you know what to do. Call 999 immediately with clear details of your location and if possible send someone to the nearest road to flag down the emergency services when they arrive. You can find the nearest life ring or anything that could help them float, and if someone goes under the water, mark on the water's edge the place they were last seen with something like a piece of clothing.

## Minutes of the Great Staughton Parish Council meeting held on 28<sup>th</sup> June 2017 in the Village Hall Committee Room

The Residents' Forum welcomed a group of parishioners from the Town who wished the Council to take note of their objections to the development at Orchard Farm. Mr Murray MacKay from Orchard Farm attended the meeting to answer questions.

Murray Mackay begin by apologising to his neighbours for the consternation caused by his application. He then went on to explain more about his business Zantra Ltd and about the planned application. The old farm buildings are no longer suitable to support the chemical company's growth plans. He argued that larger warehousing space would reduce the number of unnecessary HGV deliveries as goods could be ordered in bulk.

The principal objections voiced by residents were as follows:

- 1. The development was aesthetically unpleasing and on a scale inappropriate to a conservation area.
- 2. The scheme should be considered an industrial rather than an agricultural development.
- **3.** The concern was expressed that there might be further expansion of the buildings and some might be sublet to other, separate businesses.
- 4. Particular concern was expressed concerning traffic volumes and movements:

HGVs would be accessing the site via The Causeway, at school start and finish times.

The number of lorries was felt to be a serious underestimate.

The Causeway is going to be reconfigured to prevent cars proceeding at speed from the B645.

Manoeuvring a 40 tonne HGV around this highway improvement will cause serious H & S issues.

The East and West entrances to the village, on the B645, already have chicanes, which significantly inhibit HGV movements.

Loading / unloading vehicles will require powerful and intrusive lighting on winter days or at night.

Several of the houses in the Town have no footing, and the impact of 40 tonne HGVs is likely to be deleterious. The Kym river bridge is unsuitable for sustained HGV traffic.

The footpath from the start of the Causeway to the Town exit of the village would be a hazard to any pedestrians, particularly those walking with children, the elderly and infirm.

The Parish Council, having duly taken note of the objections of residents, decided unanimously to support their objections to this scheme and a formal letter of objection will be duly forwarded to HDC Planning Dept.

The council meet usually meets on the first Wednesday in each month for two hours depending on what needs to be discussed and council meetings are open to the public.

A parish council is the closest level of local government to the community. It is a local authority in its own right that makes decisions on behalf of the residents in its "parish" and has a District & County authority hierarchy that sits above it. Councillors are elected but are an unpaid for their time. Becoming a parish councillor is a rewarding experience and often described by those that get involved as a way of giving something back to their community.

#### **Qualifications**

Any person can be elected as a councillor if they are:

- 1. A British national, commonwealth citizen or a euro-national on the day they are nominated.
- 2. 18 years of age or over
- **3 a)** on the day they are nominated and thereafter they continue to be a local government elector for the area of the authority *or*
- **3 b)** has during the whole of the twelve months preceding that day occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in that area *or*
- **3 c)** their principal or only place of work during that twelve months has been in that area *or*
- **3 d)** during the whole of those twelve months has resided in that area *or*
- 3 e) in the case of a member of a parish council has during the whole of those twelve months resided either in the parish or community or within three miles of it.

A person is however disqualified from being elected or being a councillor if they:

- a) hold any paid employment or office in the authority that they seek election *or*
- b) are the subject of a bankruptcy
- restrictions order or other interim order *or* **c)** have within five years before the day of election or since their election been convicted of any offence and has had passed on them a sentence of imprisonment of at least three months (whether suspended or not) without
- d) has been found guilty of corrupt or illegal practices or responsible for incurring unlawful expenditure and the court ordered their disqualification.

17/041: Members Declaration of Interest on Agenda Items: None

17/042: County / District Councillor Update: Councillor Ian Gardener reported that following the realignment of the County Councillor boundaries there were now only 61 Councillors as opposed to 69. This meant that each Councillor had a larger area to cover and he had 25 Parish Councils that he was covering. The make up of the County Council following the elections in May was now 36 Conservative, 15 Liberal Democrat, 7 Labour and 3 Independent.





#### Dear Friends,

July is half over, and the holidays are upon us, and I don't know where the year has gone! I see from Facebook that the harvest in Great Staughton has begun, and that makes autumn seem closer, and that's not what I want to be thinking in July.

You may not know that I am a member of the General Synod of the Church of England, and the July sessions were from 7<sup>th</sup> to the 10<sup>th</sup> last week. You may have seen in the news that there were two debates on human sexuality, and to my surprise they were much more positively received and voted on that I had expected. It is still a difficult subject for those who are unable to accept the physical and medical reality of gay relationships, but the debates were generous and thoughtful, without any of the harsh denunciations that I have heard on some occasions. A call for a 'vote by Houses' was made: this means that the three houses of Bishops, Clergy and Laity vote electronically, every vote is recorded (and subsequently published), and a motion has to pass in all three Houses. Both the one on 'conversion therapy' (you can be talked out of being gay), and the one on a welcoming liturgy for those who have undergone a sex change (for gender dysmorphia) were passed with large majorities. A very significant change in tone and mood from the February sessions. Welcome – to me

at least – but making more difficult the relationship with the Global South churches of Africa.

At the recent PCC meeting we were planning for the licensing service for the Revd Nicki Bland, which is on September 5<sup>th</sup> at 7.30pm. If you would like to come you will be very welcome. Bishop David of Huntingdon will be leading the service, and there is a lot of movement around the church as the new priest is led to each of the key places in the church: the font, the pulpit, the altar and the priest's stall, and 'inducted' into each. This is followed by a certain amount of festivity, with wine and soft drinks and nibbles as many people say farewell to Revd Nicki from her previous posts, and she is welcomed by her new parishioners.

If you are going away on holiday I hope you all travel safely and have good weather. The recent huge traffic congestion resulting from an accident at Brampton Hut reminded us all of the long delays that can occur on the roads, and how dangerous our roads can be. Take care and enjoy a break.
