

ave you rescued a worm lately? I don't know about you but I can't walk past a stranded worm without moving it to a less hostile surface. The last one I found was swimming valiantly up the middle of Cage Lane in last month's snow melt. I picked it up and put it, considerately, on top of some freshly dug soil on the verge. It was only later that I realised that I'd probably consigned it out of the frying pan into the fire - straight into the jaws of the mole on patrol in its run underneath. Maybe worms can smell moles and avoid such situations. Who knows? Perhaps David Attenborough will enlighten us one day.

What I'm trying in a long winded way to say is that worms need to be cherished. They are very much the gardener's friend - aerating the soil and distributing and digesting organic material and making it more accessible to plants. Applying a good mulch will not only suppress weeds and retain moisture in dry spells but it will attract worms which will work hard to your soil's benefit.

April is a lovely month in the garden with everything starting to spring into life again but without getting out of control. It's a time of hope with fresh new foliage, spectacular blossom and lots of bird song. All we need is some decent weather.

Horticultural Society members will be giving a thought to what they can produce for the annual plant sale at the end of May. So often there are perennials that need to be divided or self seeded specimens in the wrong place and it is great to be able to pot up excess plants and offer them at bargain prices at the sale.

Make a mental note to come along on Saturday 26th May to the Pavilion from 2.30 - 4.00. Even if you don't want any plants it's worth coming along for a cream tea and a chat.

Well-Being by Boxworth Botanicals

s I have been out of the loop for a while here is a quick update on Great Staughton WI. February we had an informative talk on Wood Green Animal Shelter by Dawn Cox. The competition was a favourite animal item. A collection was made at the end that raised £24.71 towards the work of the shelter.

March we packed ourselves into the Pavilion as our normal venue was undergoing essential work. The talk was on Recycling given by John Crisp on behalf of Amery under trying circumstances:- missing cables, cramped space, sore throat etc. Despite that he managed, with the aid of a quiz, to convey the need for all to get involved with recycling as the UK is rapidly running out of land fill sites. Plastic and nappies were some of the biggest problems. Who knew it can take up to 500 years for a disposable nappy to decompose??? Huntingdonshire does well as far as the league tables go for recycling rates, as we are well above average, but Mr Crisp stated much more can be done by proper use of our bins and household recycling centres.

Our topic next month will be Tales from Uganda

o! A few reminders first: volunteers needed for the Abbot's Ripton Garden Show on 30 June – 1 July; our July session will be cake decorating (contrary to previous info); and our Group Meeting will be at Great Staughton this year (we hosted last year, at the church, remember?) on Tuesday 8th May; and finally, if you want a WI diary, put your name down. Oh and Curly Pat (what a lovely nickname), says to remember to sign in, buy your raffle ticket and get your name badge for the evening from Issy.

Our speaker this month was Angela Deavall, ably assisted by Janet King from Boxworth Botanicals (who now live in Catworth) - teachers and purveyors of essential oils for practically everything (god and bad) that happens in your life. So the ladies explained that they are English manufacturers of natural, organic and vegan products and that we really all should READ THE LABELS! Angela explained about parabens (a class of widely used preservatives in cosmetic and pharmaceutical products) being present in many shop-bought products and just because something says it's healthy, like 'Witch Hazel and Tea Tree', you must read the labels as it may have parabens in it too! Reading the labels will inform you that there are stabilising agents and preservatives in the products and this IS ok - EU regulations to keep us safe. So, on the label look for 'plant-based' and 'non-animal tested' – GOOD, and 'Sodium Laurel Sulfate' -BAD (it's just there to make the lather and dries the skin mightily). Also, if something says Triclosan – get that barge

-pole out and don't even touch it with that – badbadbad.

Aromatherapy has moved on since the whimsical hippy hug-a-tree of the 60s and 70s and is now part of the Wellbeing industry and based on firm science. So we learnt: peppermint gets rid of spiders (all very well for you almostarachnophobics out there but who eats the flies?) and is good for indigestion (rub it clockwise - don't ask me, something to do with the interior workings of the body); Eucalyptus is a splendid cleaning oil (also fabulous for inhaling) and likes being used with vodka to hold it all together (don't we all): Tea tree is 80 times stronger that antiseptic wipes for surfaces; Frankincense is a great anti-inflammatory so use it for arthritic joints; a drop of Lavender on your pillow will give you a restful night's sleep (my Nan did that every night and lived 'till 99) and is brilliant for insect bites and chilblains; Neroli is good for acne: Seaweed extracts are excellent for puffy eyes; and Calendula (marigold) is fab for eczema and psoriasis amongst other things.

Some of our ladies then availed themselves of the lovely products we had spent an hour trying on various bits of our persons as they were handed round - my hands had never been so soft after the several lotions and potions I had tried. I'm sure many of us will be trying our own essential oil remedies – done properly with carrier oils and the correct number of drops.

Thank you Angela, a most informative evening and one of our most gloriously fine-smelling ones too.




