



saw us gathered in the Baptist Church for an evening of kilt folding and tartan courtesy of Pat Wallace ably accompanied by her very own Mel Gibson in the shape of Stan - husband of more than 40 years and their daughter Tanya.

Like a lot of the old crafts, kilt making was passed down the family line by Pat's granny - a nurse, kilt maker and highland dancer - who moved to Peterborough to be near her family, the only kilt makers in the country. We learnt that it takes 8 yards of material to make a kilt and around 3,000 stitches (all the kilts are hand sewn, some by Stan) and take around 4 days to complete. Good eyesight and lots of patience (rare in a man!) are needed.

Pat told us that the majority of kilts are pleated to the "set" square, so the square of pattern always shows at the back. Or if you have more than a few quid to spare, to the stripe. In which case all you see at the back is the stripe. Mainly for the military and Royalty. The best cloth is called Strome. The kilts Pat brought with her were not only beautiful but quite heavy. You can just imagine the beautiful swing to them. She told us they had made kilts for David Beckham, Billy Connolly, Madonna and Guy Ritchie and many other famous names. Now I personally would quite like to have been in on

the fitting of David Beckhams kilt! (A girl can dream). Anyway.......

Pat showed us how the colours had changed over the years, much brighter and clearer now due to the use of anoline dyes. We had our very own kilt wearing member who showed off her kilt beautifully whilst Pat told us a little of the tartans history. She then asked two of our clan to model the sashes the ladies wear across the shoulder and down the back of their outfits. They were gorgeous (sashes and models) and were given as gifts toour game girls. A beautiful present I'm sure they will agree.

Pat also told us that it is the ladies who have the rights to the tartans bearing their names not the men. See, women's lib is not new! To that end, I have discovered that my tartan through my mother's maiden name is Caledonian! Loch Carron of Scotland is the place to check for yours. Pat, Stan and Tanya left us with a tray of Scottish fudge, tablet, Edinburgh rock and shortbread all gratefully snaffled at the end of the evening. Thanks to all three of you for a very enjoyable and informative evening.

Your Great Staughton Parish Council

n May 3rd this year new Parish Councils will be formed for Great Staughton and Perry. As I am part of Great Staughton Parish Council this is written from the perspective of that Council but I hope it may also apply at least in part to Perry. It is a wholly personal view.

A vibrant Parish Council representing the nature, make-up and views of the community is really important to the quality of life of a community. In many instances a Parish Council does not have powers but it does have influence. It does set a small part of the Council tax raised from residents. It can also start processes, leverage money, grants, and gain support from other bodies. I believe this is all becoming more important. The traditional Parish Council was well caricatured in the Vicar of Dibley but now many issues are being passed to Parish Councils as the District and County Councils find they are unable to fund activities.

Great Staughton Parish has a village hall, playing field and pavilion which it owns and has to maintain. The Parish Council is always consulted on planning issues and is active in making comments, and representations where it has felt appropriate.

The Parish Council provides resources to maintain the look of the village.

It has been active in trying to resolve parking and road safety issues. In Great Staughton the Parish Council has been actively pursuing the establishment of a Community Land Trust to provide affordable housing in the village for residents with a strong connection to the village as a priority. The Parish Council supports Life Magazine, a website and a Facebook page.

These are real issues which affect you locally. If you feel you might want to be a Parish Councillor, please contact the Clerk (details below). Forms need to be submitted by **April 6**th. In Great Staughton we are aware that new Parish Councillors will be needed to ensure we have a full Council of 9 members.

You may well ask what are the responsibilities and duties. You are expected to attend seven Parish Council meetings a year (dates and times are set annually in advance by the Council and can be seen on page 4 of the magazine.). Hopefully as well Parish Councillors get involved in supporting the assets, and activities in the village.

Great Staughton Community Land Trust (CLT)

The meeting on Saturday February 3rd was very well-attended by the village, with over 70 people being present. There was overwhelming support for the formation of a CLT. Many people have now committed themselves to the CLT by paying a £1 membership.

Membership is limited to those on the electoral roll in Great Staughton Parish. There were many questions raised about the details of the project to develop affordable housing for local residents on the Charities field on The Green. These were either answered or will be in considered in the establishment of the land trust and housing arrangements.

The next meeting will now be held on March 1st in the pavilion where all the members of the CLT will be invited. The purpose of that meeting is to adopt a constitution, and appoint a Board to run the not for profit business. The Board will then start defining and agreeing the lease, the types of properties, housing tenancy arrangements, and allocation policy with Luminus. Once this has been done the Solicitors can draw up the appropriate leases and planning permission can be sought.

Whilst there are clearly some very important decisions to be made it does really feel that progress is being made and there is real expectation of houses being built during 2019.

Background Information

A Steering Group has been established for the scheme, comprising of Bob Jewell (Chair), Sir Hugh Duberly, Anthony Withers, Frank Backhouse, Phil Yates, Janet Bowen and Tracey Stokes, who will also attend the meeting on February 3rd.

HDC has agreed in principle that the site of the proposed scheme could form a 'rural exception site' for planning purposes. All Local Authorities are now under a duty to establish areas of land for potential building purposes in their area, to meet government building targets.

A CLT is a legal mixture of a company, a charity and a trust, registered as a society under the Co-Operative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014, with charitable status and unable to trade for profit. CLTs are often used to run affordable housing schemes and other community based ventures.

The rules of the Gt Staughton CLT will govern who is eligible to be a member and so can apply for and own a £1 share in the CLT (must be a resident of the Parish of Gt Staughton and on its electoral roll), how it is run (by a board of 5 to 12 of the members, who are called trustees, elected for 3 year terms), how meetings must be organised and run, as well as the general powers and responsibilities of the CLT. In these respects it will be run like a company, holding an annual general meeting with reports back to its members.

Minutes of the Great Staughton Parish Council meeting held on 25 January 2018 7.30pm in the Village Pavilion

Present:

Residents' Forum - Parking Problems – Lauras Close – P. Rowe, D. Chapman, D. Hirst, W. Hirst, A. Foster -there are problems with illegally parked cars and the residents are very concerned that an accident will occur soon as their visibility is obstructed when exiting Lauras Close. Cambridgeshire Police have advised that this is a road traffic offence not simply a parking issue and indeed the Traffic Management Officer, Derek Crosby has written to the Clerk to advise that the restriction on parking is not being adhered to. Clearly illegal acts are being committed and the police will need to enforce the law. The residents indicated that the police have advised that they do not have the police time to do this and it was agreed that the PC would raise this issue with them. The Clerk will also write to local businesses asking them to politely advise their customers/users of the parking restrictions and also write to CCC Highways about the possibility of putting yellows lines in place which road users are more likely to adhere to perhaps. Mr Rowe has already placed an article in Life Magazine.

J. Reid and K. Reid – Parking problems – The Highway – the recent double yellow lines have caused a problem with parking outside their property. This is blocking their view when exiting their drive and also their exit from their house is blocked by cars parking right in front of their gate. The Clerk will ask the police to determine if blocking a pedestrian access is illegal. BJ advised that the police have visited the area in question and have advised that if a driveway is blocked, or if a car is parked on the pavement or on vellow lines then an offence has been committed and then they will act accordingly. Mrs Reid asked who owned the pavement outside of their property and BJ advised that it was probably CCC and that the PCSO had advised that as it is effectively a lay-by then people could park there. Mr Reid also expressed concerns that as a result of the work to the junction on the Causeway cars are now accelerating off the junction due to its design and that the junction should have come further out into the road. BJ advised that the shape of the iunction is as far out into the road as it could be. The PC will also ask the PCSO to attend the Parish Assembly on 19 April, so residents can raise all of their concerns direct to him. If residents are unhappy about how the police have dealt with these issue then they might also want to consider reporting this issue the Police & Crime Commissioner.
