#### **JULY BULLETIN**

We are starting to see the first glimpses of summer and the hot weather – long may it continue.

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service hopes you have all been staying fire safe with your latest outdoor activities, but just in case, here are our firefighters' top tips:

- When out camping or using a tent, never use candles inside or nearby and always discourage smoking nearby. Never cook inside a tent either.
- If cooking outdoors, keep barbeques on level ground, never pour accelerant on it and use it well away from fences, sheds and foliage.
- If you have a bonfire, build it well away from buildings, tents or other flammable objects and make sure it is properly out when you leave.
- When out in the countryside, extinguish cigarettes properly and dispose of them responsibly – never throw a lit cigarette into a field or wooded area.

Don't forget to stay safe around our county's waterways and if you see someone in trouble in water, call 999

immediately with clear details of your location.

Otherwise, take them to the WI Centre in Huntingdon 9-12am on the Friday. Also, if you wish to join in the Perry Pairs (pears) then bring your bra-hanging-basket to next month's meeting. We'll take a photo and it'll all go from there ......

So, our speaker (and do-er) was Bev Bradshaw. She came laden with all good things floral and wowed us with her skill and knowledge. We came away from Perry Church (tables were at a premium so we had

to forgo our customary glass of wine at the pub) with at least one sometimes-cottagey, sometimesclassical, sometimes-spectacular but always-creative flower arrangement. Some of us used blooms and foliage from our own gardens and others of us completely forgot, simply turning up with smiles and secateurs. It really didn't matter as Bev had brought a surfeit of riches with gerberas, love-in-a-mist, dianthus, other-lovely -flowers-whose-names-I-know-not, and enough varieties of greenery at which yer average Kew-gardener would have shed a tear of happiness. We learnt to make a chocolate-box bow (called by florists 'the idiot's bow' - probably why I couldn't get mine to look like a bow though everyone else's turned out rather lovely), to manipulate cellophane and mesh (I kid you not, more difficult than you would imagine), and to discover 'negative space' - that's floral art, not Star Wars - it's actually the gap between the flowers which gives the whole thing structure and flow (though I did hear one exchange 'Ooo get you with your negative space', 'Yes dear, between my ears').

Fun was had by all and Bev was a clear and amusing teacher, showing us how to support droopy stems, warning us of the paper-cuts to be had from Bear Grass, how florists always use their teeth, and how to treat a gerbera kindly (put them in water practically up to their neck for half an hour).

And the proof of the pudding is in the eating ... my husband woke up the next day, saw the arrangement in the fireplace and asked who had sent me flowers! Result! Thanks Bey!

**Broadband**: The last update I had was that 195 subscribers had fibre broadband activated by 19<sup>th</sup> May 2016. However, as of 1<sup>st</sup> June there is now a waiting list for fibre since the two patch cables between the two cabinets have now reached their maximum capacity of 100 connections each. If you are one of the people waiting for fibre I would appreciate you getting in touch with me please.

Despite the additional 39 fibre connections made this year I have still only received 7 full responses to my many requests for peoples' speed test results. Without this information we have no leverage with BT to improve matters within the village and get a third cable installed.

#### GREAT STAUGHTON PARISH – NEIGHBOUR-HOOD WATCH



Neighbourhood Watch: How it all began...

Back in 1964, in New York, USA, 38 witnesses stood by and watched while a young woman was murdered in the street. The story went 'viral' (as far as it could do, back then!) and the first Neighbourhood Watch schemes were set up as a community response to that horrific crime and the realisation that communities were simply not looking out for each other.

The idea spread and in 1982 the first scheme was set up in Cheshire, UK – then called Home Watch. It was only as recently as 2007 that the first national umbrella organisation for the movement was set up with the support of the Police and Home Office. Their mission statement reads:

"The aim is to bring neighbours together to create strong, friendly, active communities where crime and antisocial behaviour are less likely to happen. Our vision is that of a caring society that is focused on trust and respect in which people are safe from crime and enjoy a good quality of life. Neighbourhood Watch is about making sure that no-one has to feel afraid, vulnerable or isolated in the place where they live."

Of course, this is an ideal that we all share and for a Neighbourhood Watch scheme to work effectively in an area all residents ideally need to be involved. It's not necessarily about becoming a volunteer to help run the scheme but it is, most definitely, about looking out for your neighbour, reporting any suspicious activity to your NHW co-ordinator and, more importantly, the police, and also ensuring that anything you or your family do doesn't impact negatively on those around you. In a nutshell, it's all about being a good neighbour. That is the backbone of a truly strong community where everyone feels safe, respected and secure.

Since the recent thefts in Great Staughton, it's been encouraging to see the number of people reporting problems and keeping an eye on what goes on in the village. That really is encouraging and we hope that this level of diligence is maintained. If you do have an elderly, vulnerable neighbour that you are concerned about (or even a new resident to the village) do please let your local co-ordinator know. If you are concerned about anything happening in the village and don't know what to do about it, do please contact your NHW co-ordinator.

However, what we do ask is that you are careful about any personal information on other residents you may post up on the village Facebook page when discussing possible crime in the village. Please respect others' privacy at all times.

Your Great Staughton Neighbourhood Watch scheme won't be posting newsletters through your door every month from now on as we appreciate that advising residents of incidents after they've happened isn't necessarily useful. What we shall be doing is posting every alert we hear about on the "Great Staughton Neighbourhood Watch" Facebook page which means you will get alerts much quicker if you subscribe to receiving notifications from that page. Do please sign up, if you haven't already done so.

If there is an urgent message we need to get to our residents we will either email you (if we have your email address) or put a note through your door. If you would like us to keep you up to date by email, please email **frankbackhouse@yahoo.co.uk.** Please note: any personal details held will be protected under the Data Protection Act 1998.

#### The Bobby Scheme

The aim of the Bobby Scheme is to reduce crime and fear of crime to older, vulnerable and disabled people in Cambridgeshire, thereby improving their quality of life and increasing their independence and safety.

The Bobby Scheme secures homes of victims aged 60 and over, non victims aged 65 and over, and disabled residents. Their 'Bobbies' not only fit security equipment to the homes of the elderly victims but also give safety advice. They offer the same service to non-victims for a small donation. #### Please remember that:

- If you don't have the details of your local NHW co-ordinator, please contact Frank Backhouse on 861167.

As a final word: If someone comes to your door trying to sell you a service, or get you to sign up to Something, say NO, politely, and close the door. Most properties in Great Staughton have been given a sticker saying "We're Not Buying It" and any callers should respect that. If you haven't got one of these stickers please talk to your NHW Co-ordinator. It is a criminal offence if a caller does not leave when asked. Should you be concerned about the behaviour of the caller call the police and/or your NHW co-ordinator.



#### **Present:**

Councillors Nigel Noon (NN) Chairman, Emma Prew (EP), Kate Merrell (KM), David Prew (DP), William Wetzel (WW), Sheila Brighton (SB), John Cranston (JC), Martin Wilson – Clerk, County Councillor Peter Downes, District Councillor John Morris. There were nine members of the public in attendance.

The meeting was opened by the Chairman, Nigel Noon, at 7.32 p.m.

16/25 Apologies for Absence: Apologies had been received from Councillors Peter Lawrence, and District Councillor Patricia Jordan.

**16/26 Members Declaration of Interest on Agenda Items:** EP & DP declared an interest in item 16/38 and WW declared an interest in item 16/32

**16/27 Public Forum on Agenda Items:** There were no items raised by members of the public.

16/28 County / District Councillor Update:

The Councillors Surgery would be on Saturday 4 June and EP would be in attendance. Peter Downes explained the situation, as it stood, regarding the potentially Elected Mayor for East Anglia and that a vote would be taken at County Council on 28 June and he looked for the opinion of the Council. The Council did not feel that they had enough facts available for them to make a decision and requested that if further detail became available, prior to the vote, that this be sent to the Clerk in order that it could be distributed to the Councillors.

John Morris stated that HDC had a new leader following the previous leader being elected to the Police and Crime Commissioner position. The road by the railway station in Huntingdon would be closed on 4, 11, 18, 25 June and 2 July from 10:00 p.m. till 06:00 the following morning for bridge inspection works.

16/29 Police Update: Whilst there was no update from the Police, the Clerk had spoken with Sargent Tim Elliott at the visit of HRH Duke of Edinburgh about various matters and he had offered to assist where possible.



# Dear Friends,

In recent weeks I have been sorting out filing cabinets and drawers here at The Vicarage and discovered all the Life magazines since my arrival here in December 2002. This made me think about the journey that finally brought me to serve you as your Parish Priest in these beautiful villages. So I hope you will forgive me if I share with you a brief part-history of my life journey that brought me here!

I have always felt blessed that in my life I have been able to do the things that I love – at a very young age I knew I was going to be a nurse, and so trained as a State Registered Nurse and then a State Certified Midwife. I also knew I would go to Africa, and in 1971 flew to Lesotho as a volunteer, to nurse in a tiny, remote Anglican Mission Hospital high up in the mountains for 15 months. In that time I met the man I was to marry and so we came back to England at the end of my contract for our wedding before returning to Lesotho for a further seven and a half years.

During that time my two beautiful sons, Tim and Steven, were born and we finally returned to this country when Tim was ready to start school.

I had been out of nursing for too many years to return without a full-time refresher course and with two small children I found that Impossible, so spent the next 16 years as a Warden in a complex of bungalows caring for the elderly in the days when wardens lived on site and were 'on call' 24hours a day – and I loved it.

When the boys both went off to university I decided the time had come for a change in my life too and that was when – much to my surprise (and shock) I discovered God's call

towards entering the Church. After two years of heart-searching I finally told my sons that I was seeking this way forward and was astonished when Steven asked me if that meant I was looking at the possibility of becoming a 'lady vicar' and, admitting that was a possibility, he calmly told me I should have done that 'years ago!'

And so I began the arduous journey of discernment, with many interviews and finally a selection conference until eventually I was told I had been selected for training to the priesthood. I then began a three year part-time course on The East Anglian Ministerial Training Course while continuing to work as a warden.

I was ordained a Deacon in Ely Cathedral in June 2000 and as a Priest in July 2001 and became a curate in the six parishes of the Shingay Benefice in Ely Diocese.

Much to my surprise, in the summer of 2002 I was asked by the Bishop of Ely to come and look at these villages as a possibility of serving you in God's name, moved here in November of that year and was licensed in St Andrew's Church on December 16<sup>th</sup>

In my first letter for 'Life' January 2003, I wrote that I was looking forward to getting to know you and becoming part of the villages knowing my days would be 'filled with sunshine, promise and the joy of God's love'. God has indeed filled my life here with sunshine, promise and the joy of his love and I feel very privileged to serve you and be part of your wonderful community in his name, and I thank him for you all.


