



Life (Magazine) In The Time of Corona

It's a strange time to be the editor of a community magazine at the moment. The coronavirus pandemic is affecting our everyday lives in ways many of us couldn't have imagined, with many things we take for granted now stripped away from us. And then it dawned on me, on my third day of working from home, what could become of the Life Magazine over the coming months. After all, our little magazine relies heavily on community events and social gatherings, but with many now cancelled or postponed due to government guidelines on self-isolation and social distancing, I realised we might soon be a little thin on content. To make sure everyone is up to date, we will publish information about any cancelled events in and around Great Staughton and Perry.

With many social activities now out of the question for the foreseeable future, I have been thinking about ways technology can help. Here are a few ideas.

Video coffee mornings / virtual trips to the pub: Instead of popping round a friend's for a coffee, or meeting your pals in The Wheatsheaf, The White Hart or The Tavern, set up a video call instead. There is a host of different options - Skype, FaceTime, Whatsapp, Houseparty and Facebook Messenger all support video calls. If you're connected to your wife they're all free too.

Make the most of free TV apps: Most of us are familiar with the BBC iPlayer and ITV Hub. But you've also got the All 4 app from Channel 4 which boasts a very impressive back catalogue. Then there's the Channel 5 My5 app, UKTV Play which includes programmes from Dave, Yesterday and Drama, and Dplay. This covers Quest, Really, the Food Channel and HGTV.

Sign up to Netflix, Amazon Prime, Apple TV, BritBox, Disney+: While these options do eventually cost money, they all have a free trial. Disney+ is the newest service and offers pretty much every single Disney, Pixar, Marvel and Star Wars movie ever made, as well as National Geographic, lots of TV shows and, most excitingly (for me), 30 seasons of The Simpsons. So a lot for the kids now they're off school.

Host a Netflix Party: This has been around for some time but people are only really discovering it now. It essentially allows you and your friends to watch the same film in your own homes at the same time. It includes a group chat but it does require you watch on a computer as you need to install some extra software.

Listen to Podcasts: If you have not tried listening to podcasts, now may be a great time to start. Alternatively, download some audiobooks. I do this if I can't be bothered to read a particularly long book!

Buy some jigsaws on eBay: if you like jigsaws charity shops are a great place to get them cheaply, but if you are unable to get out to the shops then why not look on eBay. There are always plenty available, many at very reasonable prices.

Walk your dog at a distance: If you walk your dog, why not do it with friends, just keep the recommended 2 metres distant from your friends. The dogs can get as close as they like.

Make yourself familiar with Zoom: Zoom is a very easy-to-use video conference app that has surged in popularity over the last few weeks, with many teachers, chefs, and personal trainers hosting live classes. I use it every day at work for our morning editorial meetings and I love it. Reverend Nicki Bland will even be hosting church services over Zoom. You'll find all the details for this in her monthly letter later in the magazine.

If you have any suggestions of your own, Shaun and I would love to hear from you, so do email us. Maybe even send us some photos of you enjoying a drink in a virtual pub with your friends.

If you would like more information about anything I have mentioned above, do get in touch. We're about to face some tough times so we all need to help each other out where we can and make our lives as easy as possible.

GREAT STAUGHTON VILLAGE BOOK CLUB

Our book in March, **Venessa Diffenbaugh's** debut novel **'The Language of Flowers'**, led to a lively discussion: some of us loved it, some thought it unrealistic, others didn't bother finishing it.



Diffenbaugh's tale of abandonment, life in care, homelessness and finding love is a difficult read not just because it skips between the present and the past but because of the issues it raises. In turns, the central character, Victoria, is portrayed as the victim, abandoned at birth and suspicious of everyone around her because of her experiences in the care system, but she is also the bully, using others' kindness, naivete or weakness to survive. One can never be sure whether Victoria will ever find happiness or escape her past; whether there will be reconciliation of heartache at the end of the novel; or whether she will learn to interpret words as well as the language of flowers.

Victoria's love of flowers gives her the means to escape the homelessness that she at first embraces on leaving the care system on her eighteenth birthday, and she soon becomes a florist of some note. She has learnt the Victorian meanings of flowers and so, accordingly, chooses flowers to influence the situations that her customers find themselves in (San Francisco is the perfect setting to base a novel which involves flower power!) but will she find the answers to life that she is so desperately seeking for through the language of flowers?

Dear Folks

As you all know by now (unless you have been holiday in Outer Mongolia) we are facing a Corvid 19 pandemic. For many there is uncertainty and a degree of anxiety, hence panic buying:-please can anyone tell me why you need to bulk buy loo rolls? However there is also a time to be sensible and practical.

To this end a group of folk are planning to co-ordinate community support in our locality for anyone who has to self-isolate or is likely to struggle because of the situation we find ourselves in. The sorts of things we currently foresee being of use are dog walking, shopping, collecting prescriptions, grass cutting, providing meals, daily phone chats but this is not an inclusive list.

So what do we require from you? Firstly can you volunteer to help? All help will be aimed at no direct contact, i.e. leaving shopping or prescriptions on doorsteps etc. Even an hour a week would be welcome, and for some you could volunteer without leaving your own home by offering to speak to a person who is on their own, by phone.

A book about Staughton April 2020

The Parish Magazine

The only post-war issues of the Parish magazine that I have been able to obtain cover the years 1943 to 1964 with numerous frustrating gaps. 'Parish Magazine' is something of a misnomer. It was first and foremost a church magazine containing details of services, recording births and deaths and giving brief accounts of fund-raising events in support of church activities. Nor was the magazine wholly produced in the parish. It consisted of a maroon-red A3 cover folded to A4 format to enclose a magazine called The Sign, which was printed and published in London by Canadian Magazine Post. The Sign was an avowedly Christian magazine containing contributions from churchmen dealing with issues facing the national church. It was not all solemn religiosity; the November 1953 issue carried an article by Marcus Woodward on Some favourite birds illustrated with his own line drawings and a serial story entitled A matter of doubt by HF Winter. The Sign derived much of its income from advertising, mostly for worthy causes. There was plea to support the Church of England Waifs and Strays Society and the Royal Cancer Hospital highlighted cancer 'one of the greatest enemies of humanity.' This in the middle of a war which threatened western civilisation! Light relief was offered by claims of the benefits of using Cardinal tile polish, Kolydos dental cream and Mansion Polish ('Housewives doing wartime duty find Mansion polish the quick and easy way of keeping the home bright and clean').

The back page of the cover was given over to advertisements for local businesses and there were many, amongst them RB Wilmer, family butcher, DL Mumford, grocer and draper, Frank W Lack, grocer and general dealer, George Measures Cycle Agent, HA Harding, miller and baker, names which recur in the

magazine over the next dozen years.

In the years from 1947 to the mid-1950s Great Staughton had its own theatre company, the St Andrew's Players and they put on numerous performances during those years. 27 February 1947 was the opening night for their production of 'Painted Sparrows' by Guy Paxton and Edward V Hoile. 'Quiet Weekend' by Esther McCracken was the April 1950 presentation, with Michael Stratton, Francis Halsall, Jean Cutler and Pamela Dunne in the leading roles. Minor roles were played by Harry Pitt and Dick Bruce. A more ambitious production came in March 1951 when the St Andrew's Players presented Noel Coward's family saga, 'This Happy Breed,' later made into a morale-boosting film. Vic Fensome took the leading role supported by Grace Cutler and Margaret MacGregor. The March 1952 presentation was the play 'Little Lambs Eat Ivy' by Noel Langley, screenwriter for 'the Wizard of Oz.'

The recent murderous assault in Hanau in which many were killed, brought unwelcome publicity to the German city. Hanau has an intimate connection with Great Staughton. When Charles II was restored to the throne in 1660, his first act was to exact vengeance on all those who had signed his father's death warrant. As one of the signatories, Valentine Wauton had good reason to fear for his life and promptly fled to Hanau which at the time was a prosperous (and Protestant) trading centre. Wauton's sojourn in the town was short-lived. When the queen of the province discovered Hanau was harbouring a regicide, she was not amused and Wauton (You'll have to buy the book to find out what happened next.)

FIRE & RESCUE SERVICE**
Working together to improve community safety

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is looking for on-call firefighters to join on-call fire stations around the county. On-call firefighters aren't based at a fire station, instead they carry a pager and respond to emergency incidents as and when they happen.

The Service has introduced a new daytime contract to the on-call service, which allows people to be available to respond to emergencies from just 24 hours a week, for example while working at their regular day job or from home.

The new contract is available for anyone interested in joining an on-call station, providing they can offer a minimum of 24 hours per week (between 7am and 7pm during the week) and attend the weekly drill night.

On-call firefighters can be men and women that come from every walk of life. They may be at home, working for themselves or a nearby company, or even out in their local community. They must maintain their availability to respond to emergencies by staying within five minutes travel time of the fire station. They receive an annual wage plus additional payments for attending incidents and drill nights.

19/161 Members Declaration of Interest on Agenda Items: None

19/162 County/District Councillor Update:

DT explained that an increase has been agreed for District Council Tax of 2.6%, but this is not yet confirmed. It would mean an increase of under £10 for Band D properties. He reminded the meeting that the District Council collects monies for Cambridgeshire County Council as well, which includes sums for the Police and other services.

There will be press releases coming out about:

1. The Training Shed in St Ives. This will be for people who would like more than a gym or a boot camp and is on the site of the Outdoor Centre. If it proves successful it will become available elsewhere.

There is a scheme for low income resi-

dents so that some who are on means tested benefits can access the Training Shed for 10 sessions at a reduced price.

2. St Neots – East West Rail. This line will connect Oxford to Cambridge and a new station will be built just south of St. Neots.

3. Marshalls Engineering are looking at new site to build on and currently one of them is around Wyton Airfield area. If successful this would create significant employment in the area.

DT informed the meeting that he now sits on the Planning Committee.

He also pointed out that his Party's manifesto is not about cutting services but looking for growth and wanted everyone to know that he will speak up for rural parishes if required.

DT offered to help when required with the parking issues around the Village. Details of contacts to be sent to him

A member of the public has offered to count the number of cars parking around the village and notify the Parish Council

He also informed the meeting that Dave Scott-Martin is coming to Perry. Formerly a member of ELO he will be performing at the Baptist Church on 17th April, when

you can listen to his songs and stories. Admission is by ticket only as there are limited places but the event is free.

The Prison will be repairing the lighting at the back of Moat Lane within the next few months but by April.




