

OCTOBER BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

inter is coming and Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is encouraging all residents to get their chimney professionally swept before the cold sets in.

Top tips to enjoy an open fire safely:

- Sweep your chimney at least once a year and get brickwork inspected, especially the chimney breast and roof space.
- * Do not bank fires too high or overload the grate, and remember to let them burn down well and check the hearth before going to bed.
- * Use a fire or spark guard to prevent accidental fires.
- * Do not place objects on or over the mantle-piece which may cause you to stand too close to the fire to reach or use them.
- Burn only suitable fuels and avoid burning resinous woods as soot builds up quickly.
- Above all, ensure you have a working smoke alarm fitted on each floor or your home and a carbon monoxide alarm installed.

Extended Entitlement – 30 hours of free childcare for working parents

t present all 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to 570 hours of Government funded childcare per year. How can you make the best use of equipment to help with hearing loss?

ambridgeshire Hearing Help is a charity for people with hearing loss.
Our mission is to reduce the impact of hearing loss on daily lives.

Hearing loss can be a constant irritant if you are struggling to hear conversation or the television. It can also cause embarrassment if the TV is too loud and annoying the neighbours, or you mishear important information on the phone. Hearing aids go some way to ameliorate the problems but for many people something a bit more is required to get clarity of sound where and when they need it.

There is now a good range of assistive equipment available for many situations, depending on lifestyle. A personal listener can make meetings much easier to follow; a TV listeners allows you to cut down the sound from the TV while you listen through your own headset with control over volume; and a doorbell with a flashing light reduced anxiety about missing the caller at the door. The prices vary but a good amplified phone will cost no more than the standard product. It is always worth inquiring whether you are eligible for the support of the County Council sensory team.

We operate a drop-in session in Great Staughton once a quarter. These are always on a **Tuesday at 2pm to 4pm**, along with sessions in St. Neots and Brampton. The remaining date for the Staughton drop-in this year is **25th October.**

These drop-in sessions are for NHS hearing aid users only and we offer free replacement batteries, cleaning and re-tubing hearing aids. We also offer free advice on hearing aid use.




